Transform? The word TRANSFORM and all it indicates about changing is fitting for the season of Lent. And the question mark—how does that fit in your Lent?

- Does it offer "transformation" as one option with "staying the same" as the other? Is it an invitation to imagine yourself more peaceful, joyful and fulfilled if a transformation did occur?
- 2. Question marks usually signal a request for information. Is it asking you what aspect of your life needs transformation?
- 3. Is it there because those who know what needs transforming must determine if now is the time for it? St. Paul in the Ash Wednesday reading from the Second Corinthians insists, "Now is a very acceptable time,"—now

is the day for this partnership with Grace to move me along toward Salvation.

If you present yourself for ashes, you have put yourself in a great position to end Lent transformed and not the same! Ashes claim for me a place with those who understand their dependence upon God. So much of life draws us toward a deeper sense of independence: abilities, authority, responsibility, etc.

The fundamental transformation each of us always needs is towards living out one's dependence upon God. Patience, respect, generosity and prioritizing time for prayer—are they not all expressions of dependence upon God? Patience expresses trust that God is working in another person's time-line. Respect expresses that God's value of this person always makes them more than a problem. Prayer says I'm humble enough to see that this issue needs God as part of the solution



more than it needs anything I bring. Are any of those virtues the transformation you need? Are one of those, or another



quality like them, your response to the second use of the question mark?

Transform? also invites us to make it happen now, not later. Can you hear the Question Mark saying to you, "You've tried to ignore, or qualify, or substitute transforming this; is it time to just do it?" The transformation tools of Lent make this the right time! The aids readily available during Lent can help support you and your prayer time. The discipline of fasting from meat on Friday can shape fasting from anger, selfishness, and the reactions that work against patience or respect the other days of the week. Works of charity can reinforce that dependence upon God to supply what I gave away to you. Truly is there any time like Lent to transform? The Church would say no, with an exclamation point!

In the coming weeks, you will hear about important work being done to our facilities. We're asking for your support as we tackle work on the school roof and Martin Hall tunnel, as well as future maintenance.

The school roof had been leaking and needed to be replaced. The building serves RE students, CEW participants and attendees of other parish events.

The Martin Hall tunnel is the only wheelchair accessible entrance to

Martin Hall, which hosts numerous parish and private events throughout the year. The tunnel sustains considerable water damage each year. Work is needed to repair the tunnel and prevent future damage.

For years, the parish has had a renovation fund to help pay for facilities improvements. This fund has been used for projects like the Martin Hall remodel and the parking lot replacement. We're asking for your help to replenish this fund now, so we will be well prepared for future facility improvements.

WHEN WE CELEBRATE THE TRIDUUM



The high point of the liturgical year is the Easter Triduum. This is the three days of Holy Thursday,

Good Friday and Holy Saturday. When we celebrate the Triduum, we're not simply reenacting something that happened 2000 years ago. We actually participate in the events themselves through our living faith. These events exist outside of time and are made present in the Liturgy and the Sacraments. Mass, especially the

Triduum, is an invitation to enter into Jesus' sacrifice for us all.

We attend the Last Supper and receive the gift of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. We enter into the deep meaning of the Holy Priesthood. We pour ourselves out like the water in the basins used to wash feet. We're asked with the disciples to watch with the Lord. We're invited to enter with Him into His anguish in the Garden of Gethsemane.

On Good Friday, we stand with Mary at the foot of the Cross where heaven is rejoined to earth and earth to heaven. We enter into the moment that forever changed - and still changes - human history, the great gift of the Son of God who did for us what we could never do by trampling on death.

We wait at the tomb during Holy Saturday. That night at the Easter Vigil, we witness the Glory of the Resurrection and the beginning of the New Creation as Jesus rises again. As with every time we come together, when we celebrate the Triduum, we walk with Jesus as He saves us.
