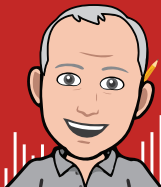

You can also use the **Speak Up, Speak Out** tip line through the Wisconsin Department of Justice to submit a confidential and anonymous report.

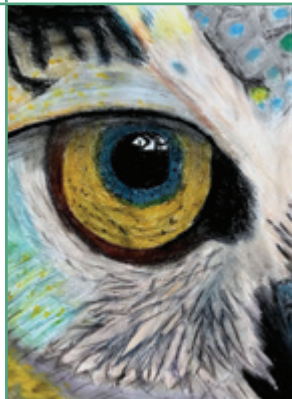
