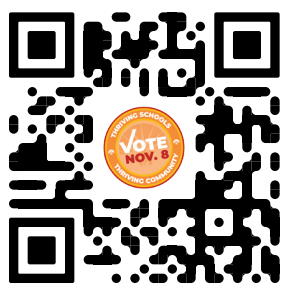

Costs are increasing, and revenue is stagnant.



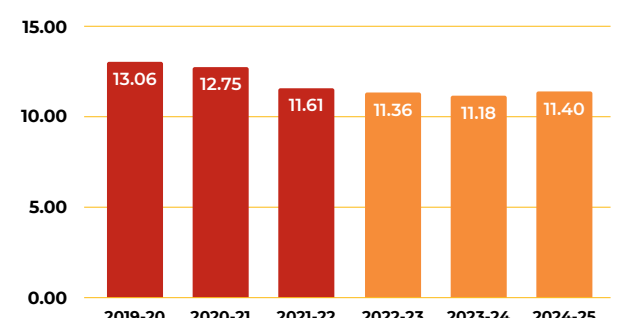
Just as inflation has made things more expensive for families (groceries and utilities), they have also made costs rise for our District (staff pay and utilities). At the same time costs have been skyrocketing, per-pupil funding from the state has remained flat.

This referendum is a way for the District to bridge that large funding gap so we can keep providing our students an exceptional education.

The Referendum is for \$9 million per year. To minimize the tax impact, the District would phase this in by adding about \$3 million each year. That way, local growth and new construction in the area can help cover the additional revenue each year.

Even with a successful referendum, the property tax rate levied by the District is still projected to be lower after three years than the current rate.

Historical and Projected Tax (Mill) Rates





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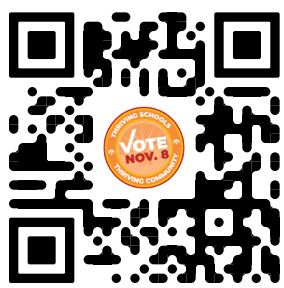
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
